Some of his larger-than-life public murals can be seen on college campuses, at airports and along the hull of the entire Norwegian Cruise Line ship Escape. His successes have allowed him to engage in many philanthropic, conservation and educational research efforts.

Harvey has dedicated his life to the sea and his many philanthropic efforts have thrown into
